

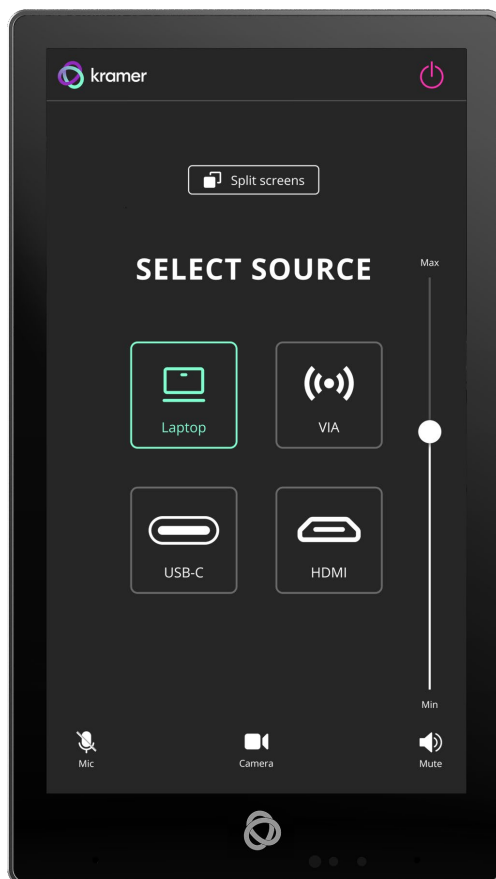

Achieving Best Performance

- Use only good quality connection cables (we recommend Kramer high-performance, high-resolution cables) to avoid interference, deterioration in signal quality due to poor matching, and elevated noise levels (often associated with low quality cables).
- Do not secure the cables in tight bundles or roll the slack into tight coils.
- Avoid interference from neighboring electrical appliances that may adversely influence signal quality.
- Position your Kramer **KT-205WM** away from moisture, excessive sunlight and dust.

Congratulations on purchasing your **Kramer KT-205WM 5.5" Touch Panel**.

KT-205WM is a new powerful, 5.5 inch, IPS, multi-touch, touch panel with 720x1280 resolution. Elegantly designed for wall-mounted decorative room integration.

KT-205WM runs the latest Android 11, supports wired PoE (Power over Ethernet) and advanced Wi-Fi connectivity options. The touch panel has a built-in speaker and camera and comes with a wall mount. The touch panel is easy to assemble, with elegant wiring and secured mounting providing reliable operation and flexible deployment.

KT-205WM touch panel is ideal for any 24/7 Kramer-supported commercial AV or control applications and features a user-friendly, fully customizable graphical user interface configured by Kramer software.

This section defines KT-205WM.

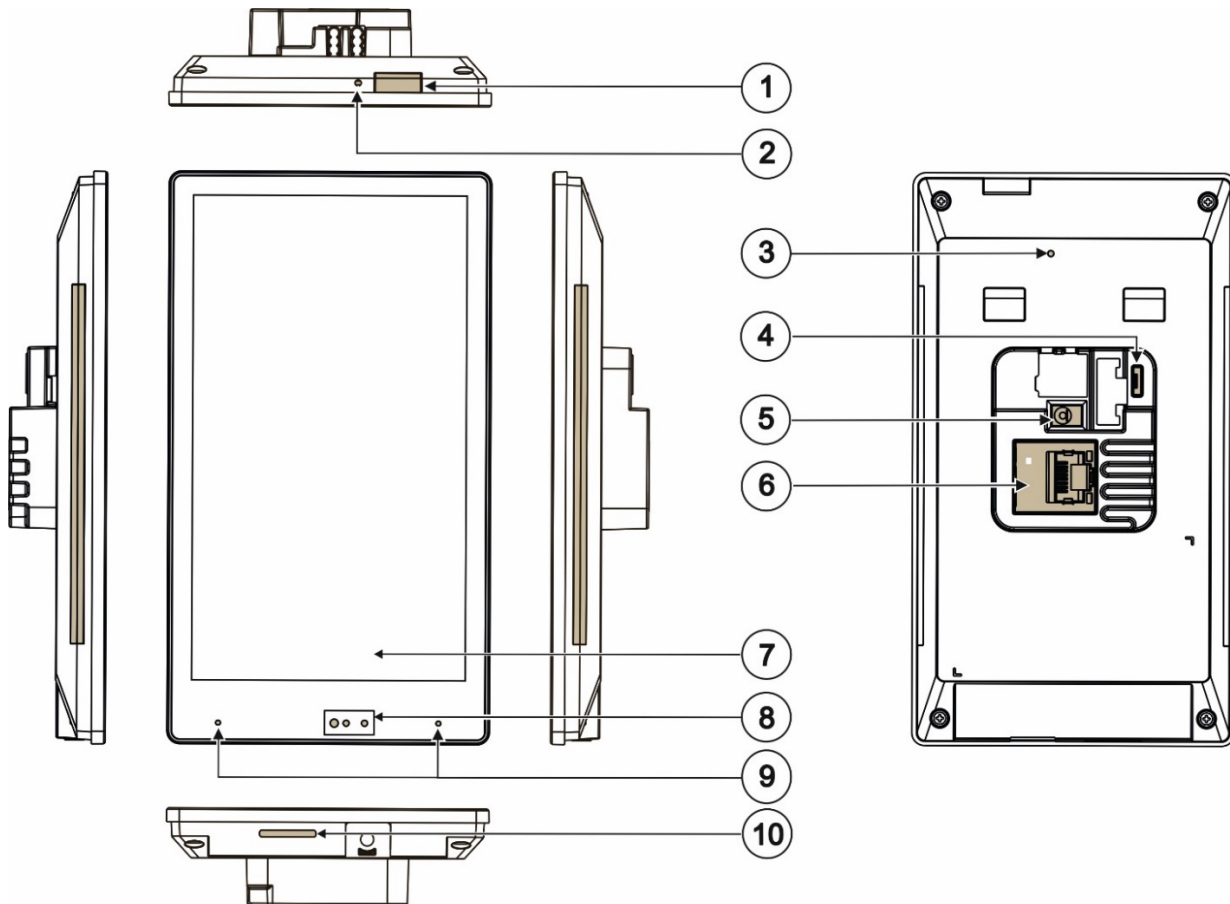


Figure 1: KT-205WM 5.5" Touch Panel

#	Feature	Function
①	Home Button	Press to wake up / darken the screen.
②	Recessed Restart Button	Located on the top-side. Insert a pin and hold for a few seconds to restart.
③	Restore Factory Reset Button	Insert a pin and hold for 22 seconds to reset the device to factory default values.
④	Micro USB Port	For connecting to an adjacent on-wall USB device and for firmware upgrade.
⑤	12V/1A DC Connector	Connect to the power adapter (optional, purchased separately).
⑥	LAN 1G(PoE) RJ-45 Port	Connect to the LAN for network communication. KT-205WM is powered by PoE (power over ethernet) delivered through the LAN port. Optionally, you can connect the power adapter too (as backup).
⑦	Display	Touch panel.
⑧	Light Sensor	Automatically adjusts the screen brightness according to the room lighting conditions.
⑨	Microphone	For audio communication, recording or conferencing.
⑩	Speaker	To output the sound.

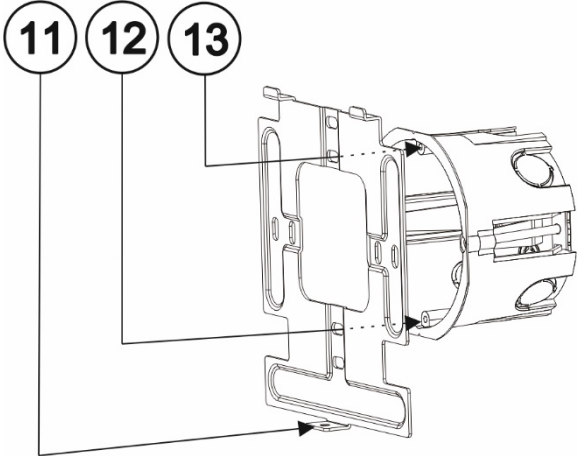



Figure 2: On Wall Mount

11	Screw Opening	For securing the 5.5" Touch Panel to the wall mount bracket using the supplied M2.5 screw.
12	M3.2 Screw Opening	For securing the wall mount bracket to the gang box.
13	M3.2 Screw Opening	For securing the wall mount bracket to the gang box.

Mounting the KT-205WM

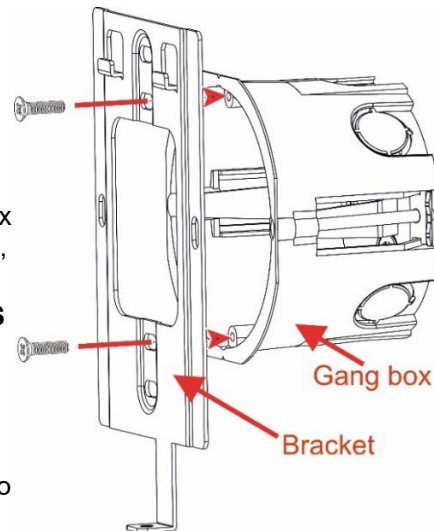
 Always be careful when attaching or removing the 5.5" Touch Panel from a mount.

Mounting KT-205WM on a Wall

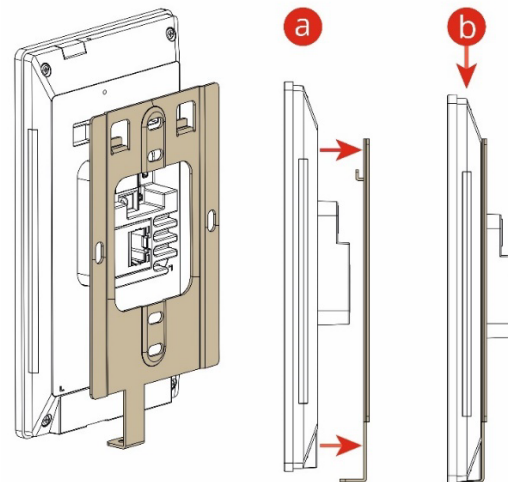
To mount the device on a wall:

 **KT-205WM can only be mounted in portrait mode.**

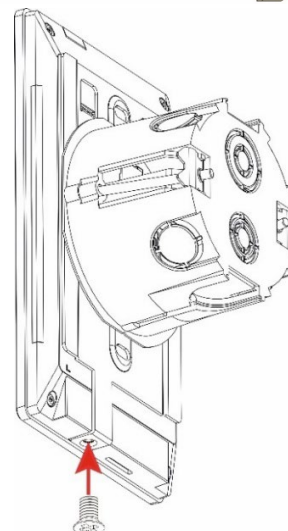
1. Install an in-wall gang box.
2. Attach the wall mount bracket to the installed gang box (top side up: see the indication arrows on the bracket), using two M3.2 screws provided.
The wall mount bracket works with UK, EU and US single gang boxes. Screws are provided for all configurations.
3. Connect Ethernet and/or power cables and optionally, insert the micro-USB cable (supplied) for connecting to an adjacent external USB device.



4. Rest **KT-205WM** on the wall mount bracket:
 - a) Line up the top holders and the bottom mounting screw hole.
 - b) Push the touch panel down, snapping the top holders into place.




5. Insert one M2.5 screw below the touch panel and secure the touch panel to the wall mount bracket.



Connection Options

Connect KT-205 to power using one or both of the following options:

1. Connect the PoE-enabled LAN RJ-45 connector to your local area PoE-enabled network.
2. Connect the power adapter to the 12V DC connector on the rear side. The power adapter is optional: It can be purchased separately.

 When both PoE and the power supply are connected to the touch panel, the unit is powered by the power supply.

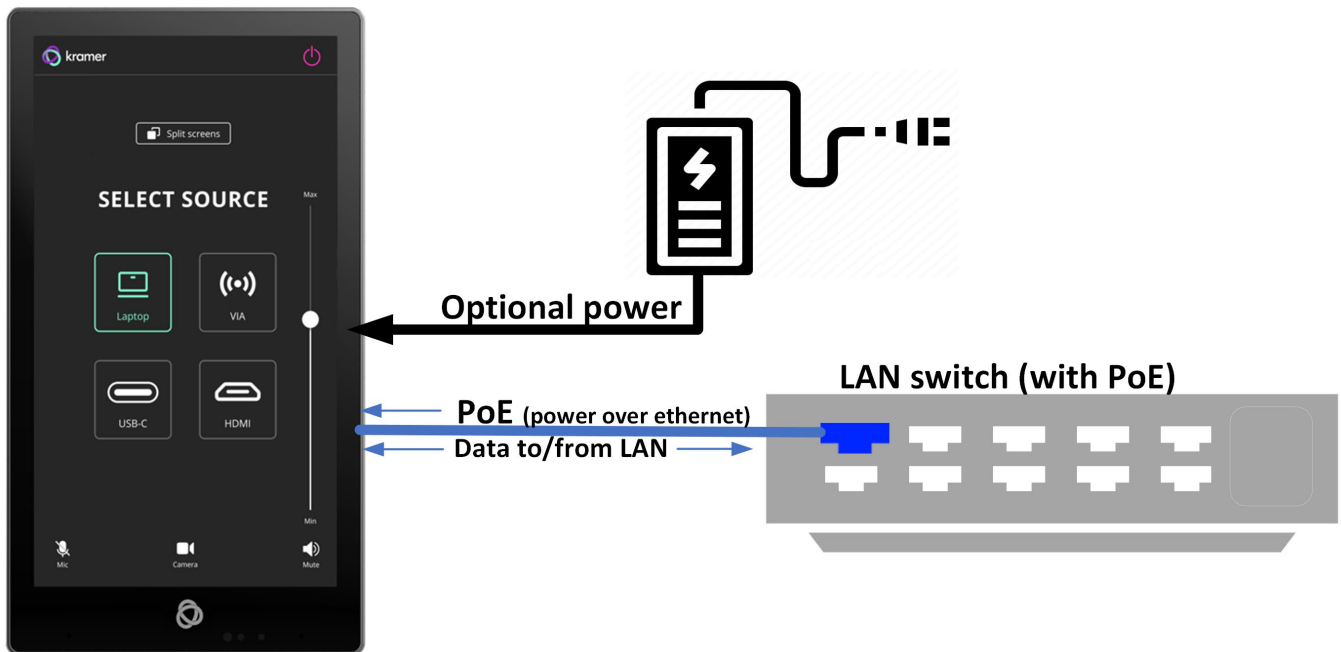


Figure 3: Powering the Touch Panel

Controlling KT-205WM

Using Navigation Buttons or Gestures

By default, **KT-205WM** runs the Kramer Control agent and displays its login screen at start-up. You can also use navigation buttons displayed at the bottom of the screen or setup your device to use gesture-based navigation.

Using navigation buttons


Swipe a finger upwards from the line at the bottom of the screen and release to see the navigation buttons:

- ◀ - **Back** – Returns to the previous screen (or opens the home page if there is none).
- - **Home** – Opens the home page, see [Using the Home Page](#) on page [10](#).
- - **Recent apps** – Scroll between the active apps.

Changing the navigation system

By default, navigation buttons are used, however the touch panel can be set to use gesture navigation instead.

To change the navigation method:


1. If the touch panel is running the Kramer Control agent, exit the Kramer Control agent by entering the PIN (default 9428). If the PIN button is not displayed, swipe up from the Kramer icon at the bottom of the screen to bring up the PIN entry pop-up.
2. On the Home page, press **Settings** . The device's **Settings** menu opens.
3. Select **Advanced settings > System**.
4. In the System menu, press **Gestures** and then **System navigation**.
5. Select **Gesture navigation** or **3-button navigation**. If you are using Gesture navigation, the sensitivity is adjustable.

Using Gesture navigation

- **Back** – Drag a finger inwards from the left or right edge of the screen.
- **Home** – Swipe a finger upwards from the line at the bottom of the screen and release.
- **Recent apps** – Swipe a finger upwards from the line at the bottom of the screen and hold.

Hiding the Navigation Bar

To hide/unhide the navigation bar:

1. On the Home page, press the **Settings** button . The device's **Settings** menu opens.
2. In the Settings menu, open **Player settings** and enable **Fullscreen mode**.

Using the Home Page

Swipe a finger upwards from the line at the bottom of the screen and release to see the navigation buttons:

- - **Home** – Opens the home page.

The Home page contains the following icons:



- Chromium browser




- Touch panel settings



- Kramer Control Agent

Exiting or Starting the Kramer Control app

KT-205WM comes with a **Kramer Control agent** (icon ) pre-installed app. The role of this app is to display an interface that you defined in Kramer Control.

When the touch panel starts, the Kramer Control agent runs automatically. To exit the Kramer Control agent, enter the PIN (default 9428). If the PIN button is not displayed, swipe up from the Kramer icon at the bottom of the screen to bring up the PIN entry pop-up.

To re-open the Control Agent click the  icon on the Home page.

During initial installation the k-agent app may need to be started manually the first time.

Basic Settings of KT-205WM

Essential First Steps

To exit the Kramer Control agent, enter the PIN (default 9428). If the PIN button is not displayed, swipe up from the bottom of the screen to bring up the PIN entry pop-up.

To re-open the Control Agent click the  icon on the Home page.


The following are essential first steps in using the touch panel:

1. **Set the device date and time;** [Setting the Date and Time](#) on page [11](#).
2. **Setup the Ethernet and/or Wi-Fi connections;** [Connecting to Wi-Fi or Ethernet](#) on page [12](#).
3. **Consider changing the time that the system checks for firmware (OS) updates;** [Changing the Automated Firmware Update](#) on page [14](#). By default, this is set to midnight, change it if you have no internet access at midnight or prefer another time.
4. **Consider changing the time that the system checks for Kramer Control (APK) updates;** [Changing the Automated Kramer Control Agent Update](#) on page [16](#). By default, this is set to midnight, change it if you have no internet access at midnight or prefer another time.
5. **Setup the Kramer Control agent;** See [Using the Kramer Control agent \(connecting to Brain\)](#) on page [18](#).
6. **Change the display language (if necessary);** [Setting the Display and Keyboard Language](#) on page [17](#).

Setting the Date and Time

The device arrives preset to New York time and you will need to set the correct time region.

To adjust the date and time settings:

1. If necessary, swipe up from the bottom of the screen to bring up the PIN entry pop-up and enter the PIN (default 9428).
2. On the Home page, press the **Settings** button . The device's **Settings** menu opens.
3. Select **Date & Time > Time zone**.
4. Set the correct **Region**. The time will display correctly.

Connecting to Wi-Fi or Ethernet

Connect an Ethernet cable to the device or activate Wi-Fi and setup a connection to your Wi-Fi. If multiple network connections are used, Ethernet will be prioritized over any others.

If you are using 802.1X authentication, do [Installing an 802.1X Certificate](#) on page [13](#), before you connect to the internet.

Connecting Ethernet

Ethernet connections must be plugged into the back of the device, see ⑧ in [Defining KT-205WM 5.5" Touch Panel](#) on page [5](#). By default, the IP address of the device is set automatically by a DHCP server.

Enabling 802.1X Authentication


1. Do [Installing an 802.1X Certificate](#) on page [13](#).
2. In the **Settings** screen, select **Network & Internet > Ethernet**.
3. Make sure the **Ethernet** is disabled and then enable **Security**.



802.1X authentication cannot be applied to active Ethernet connections

4. Select **802.1X settings** and input the **EAP** (Extensible Authentication Protocol) information. 802.1X authentication is enabled.


Using a Static IP Address

1. If necessary, swipe up from the bottom of the screen to bring up the PIN entry pop-up and enter the PIN (default 9428).
2. From the Home page, open the **Settings** screen .
3. In the Settings screen, select **Network & Internet > Ethernet**.
4. Press **Ethernet IP mode** and select **Static**.
5. Enter the IP information and press **Connect**.

The static IP address is setup.

Connecting Wi-Fi

Enabling 802.1X Authentication

1. Do [Installing an 802.1X Certificate](#) on page [13](#).
2. From the Home page, open the **Settings** screen .
3. In the Settings screen, select **Network & Internet > Wi-Fi**.
4. Make sure **Use Wi-Fi** is enabled. The device will scan and list the Wi-Fi networks.
5. Select a Wi-Fi SSID, check **Advanced options** and enter the Wi-Fi information in the fields that appear, then press **Connect**.
6. If you are using 802.1X authentication, then add the certificate information.


802.1X is enabled.

Installing an 802.1X Certificate

802.1X certificates enhance the security of network authentication. **KT-205WM** support .pem, .pfx and .p12 certificate formats.

Installing a certificate is a two-stage process: First import the certificate, then set it up.

Importing an 802.1X Certificate

1. Copy the certificate file to an empty USB flash drive.
2. If necessary, swipe up from the bottom of the screen to bring up the PIN entry pop-up and enter the PIN (default 9428).
3. From the Home page, open the **Settings** screen .
4. Select **Advanced settings > Security > Encryption & credentials**.

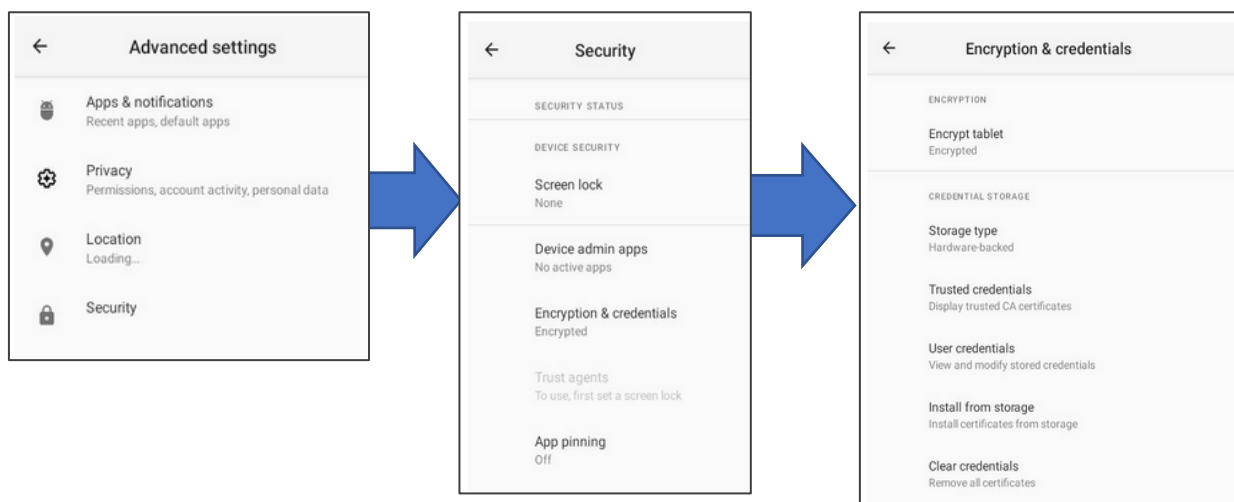




Figure 4: The path to Install from storage

5. In the Encryption & credentials screen, select **Install from storage**: The **Install a certificate** screen opens.
6. Select the **Wi-Fi certificate**: The **Recent** files screen opens.
To browse to the file location, press the 3 lines  at the top left of the screen.
7. Select the credentials file and install it, some certificates require you to know a password.
An 802.1X certificate is imported.

Setting up an 802.1X Certificate

1. In the Settings screen, select **Network & Internet > Wi-Fi**.
2. Select **Install from storage**: The **Install a certificate** screen opens.
3. Select **Wi-Fi certificate** (also for Ethernet connections): The **Recent** files screen opens.
To browse to the file location, press the 3 lines  at the top left of the screen.


802.1X certificate is set.

After installing the certificates, see [Connecting to Wi-Fi or Ethernet](#) on page [12](#) for instructions on using the certificates. Ethernet must be disabled before setting-up Ethernet certificates.

Changing the Automated Firmware Update

KT-205 arrives preset to check for firmware (touch panel OS) updates at midnight. If an update is found, the device will download the update file and install it. If you prefer to run manual updates, you must manually download the update file and then install it in the touch panel.

Changing the Time of the Firmware's Automated Update

1. If necessary, swipe up from the bottom of the screen to bring up the PIN entry pop-up and enter the PIN (default 9428).
2. From the Home page, open the **Settings** screen .
3. Select **Firmware update** and then select **Remote firmware upgrade URL**.

Remote firmware upgrade URL is the site from which the firmware is downloaded.

The upgrade URL (case sensitive):

4. A pop-up opens, inviting you to set the check time:

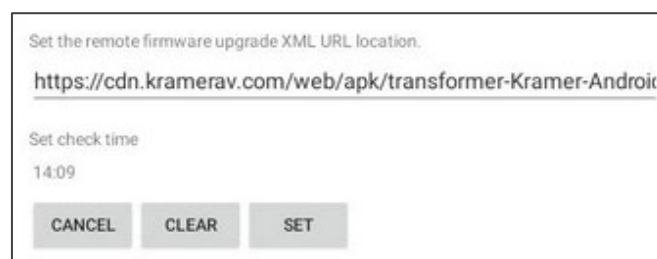


Figure 6: The Remote firmware upgrade URL page

5. To change the time that the system checks for updates, press **Set check time** and select a new time.
6. Press **OK** to close the window and then press **SET**.



Changing (or clearing) the URL will disable the updates.

The time of the automated firmware check is set.

Manually Updating the Firmware


Manual firmware updates require a downloaded firmware file from Kramer.

The firmware upgrade process requires:

- An empty USB flash drive to store the firmware file.
- A micro-USB OTG (on the go) cable to connect the USB flash drive to the touch panel.
- Access to the back of the touch panel.

You may need to remove the touch panel from its mount for this purpose. The touch panel should remain connected to a power source such as PoE or the optional power adapter (see ©in [Defining KT-205WM 5.5" Touch Panel](#) on page 5).

To upgrade the firmware:


1. Download the firmware update file from the Kramer website at www.kramerav.com/product/KT-205WM.
 - Verify that you are using the correct **KT-205WM** firmware file as there maybe more than one firmware file available.
 - Do not unzip the firmware update file.
2. Copy the firmware file to an empty USB flash drive.
3. On the touch panel, open the **Settings** screen .
4. Select **Firmware update** and then select **Firmware update** (again).
5. Plug the USB flash drive into a micro-USB OTG cable and connect the cable to the back of the touch panel.
6. Click **START FIRMWARE UPDATE**.

The firmware update will then begin.

Changing the Automated Kramer Control Agent Update

KT-205 arrives preset to check for updates to the Kramer Control Agent at midnight every day. If an update is found, the device will download the update file and install it.

Changing the time of the automated APK update check

1. If necessary, swipe up from the bottom of the screen to bring up the PIN entry pop-up and enter the PIN (default 9428).
2. From the Home page, open the **Settings** screen .
3. Select **Remote APP upgrade URL**.

Remote APP upgrade URL is the site from which the APK is downloaded.

The upgrade URL (case sensitive) is:

https://cdn.kramerav.com/web/apk/remote_app_update.xml

4. A pop-up opens, inviting you to set the check time:

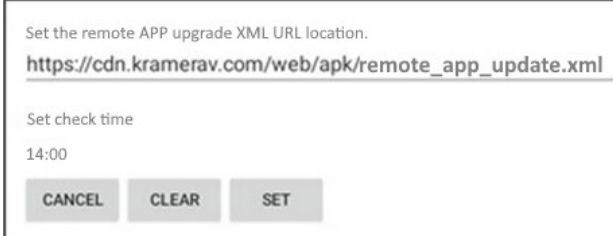


Figure 7: The Remote APP upgrade URL page

5. Press **Set check time** to select a new time.
6. Press **OK** to close the window and then press **SET**.




Changing (or clearing) the URL will disable the updates.

The time of the automated APK update check is changed.

Setting the Display and Keyboard Language

To set your preferred interface language:

1. If necessary, swipe up from the bottom of the screen to bring up the PIN entry pop-up and enter the PIN (default 9428).
2. From the Home page, open the **Settings** screen .
3. Select **Language & input**.
4. Select **Languages**.
5. Press **Add a language** to select a language.
6. If you are using multiple languages, the order in which they are listed represents the priority assigned to them, change the order by dragging languages.

The keyboard language has been set.

Using the Kramer Control agent (connecting to Brain)

The KT-205WM touch panel contains a Kramer Control agent (an app), which connects to Kramer Control. **Kramer Control's Brain** creates customized interfaces which the Kramer Control agent can display on the touch panel. The customized interfaces can control all aspects of a meeting space. For more information about **Kramer Brain**, see <https://www.kramerav.com/product/KramerControl>.

When the touch panel starts, the **Kramer Control agent** loads automatically (it is pre-installed on KT-205WM). If an interface has been defined, it will be displayed.

If this is the first time the Kramer Control app has run, then it will ask you to enter the URL & port number of the customized interface you have chosen to display.

Interface URL

The URL of the customized interface is generated by KC-Brain or by your SL-240 / SL-280 interface. The URL is always followed by a port number (and a code on SL-240 / SL-280).

The hardware section of the builder's Brain Info contains the URL (in the format IP:port#) of the customized Brain interface.

Port Numbers

Different versions of the Kramer Control Brain use different port numbers:

1. **Kramer SL-240 or SL-280:** Port 8000.
2. **KC-Virtual Brain 1:** Port 8001.
3. **KC-Virtual Brain 5:** Ports 8001 – 8005 (KC-Virtual Brain 5 can define up to 5 different touch pad control interfaces, each will use a different port).

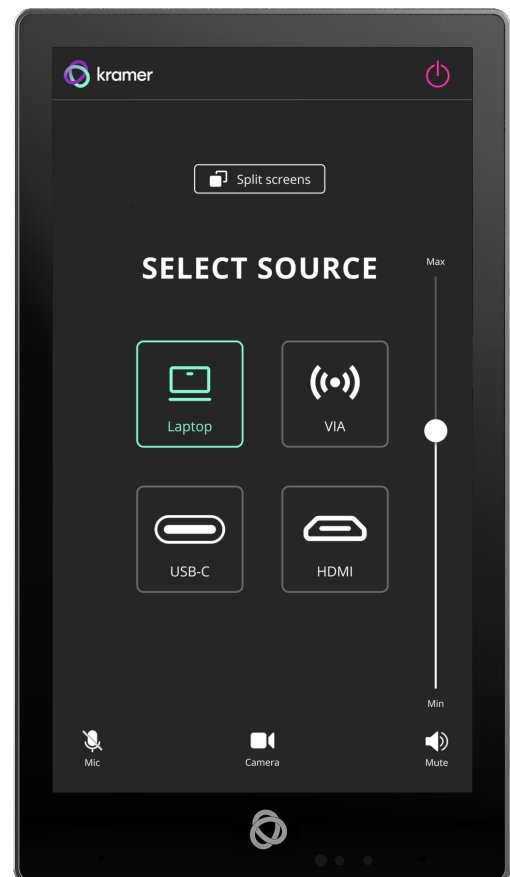


Figure 8: Example of a touch panel interface menu

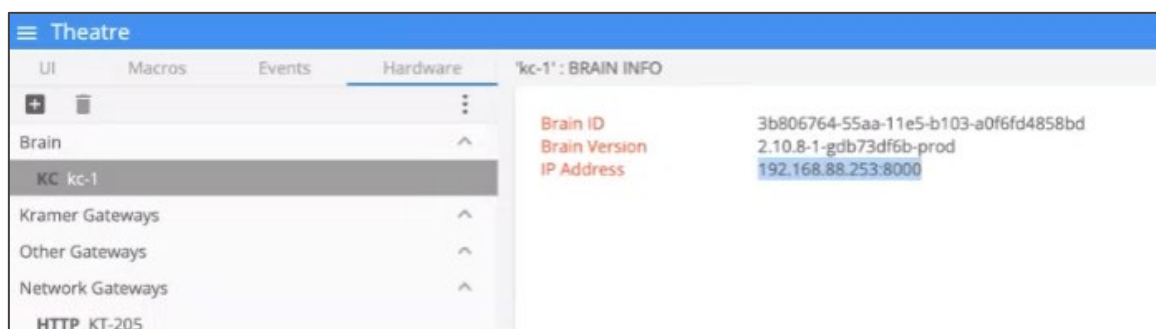


Figure 9: Interface IP Address

Updating the interface URL in the Kramer Control agent

There are 3 possible methods of updating the interface URL in the Kramer Control agent:

1. In the Kramer Control agent (on the touch panel screen).
2. In a web browser (on a remote computer connected to the same network).
3. In the Brain software (setting up the touch panel in the Brain software).

Any one of these methods can load the interface URL into the touch panel's Kramer Control agent.

1. Entering the interface URL in the Kramer Control agent

- a. Kramer Control agent opens automatically when the touch panel starts. If no interface URL has been entered, this is how the screen looks:

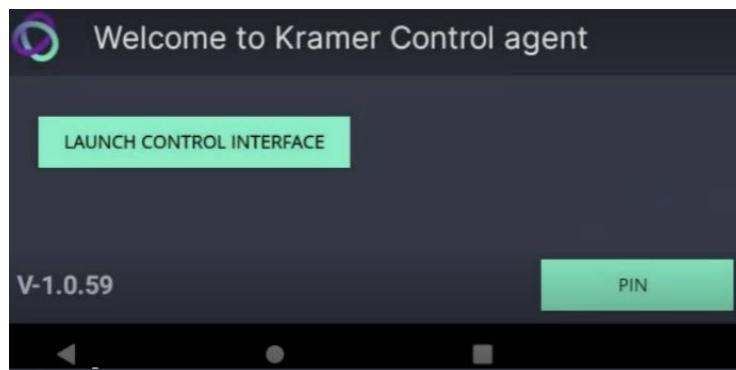



Figure 10: Touch panel running the Kramer Control agent

- If the touch panel is not displaying the Kramer Control agent, open the **Kramer Agent** app  from the touch panel's Home page.
- b. Press LAUNCH CONTROL INTERFACE, the URL entry pop-up appears.

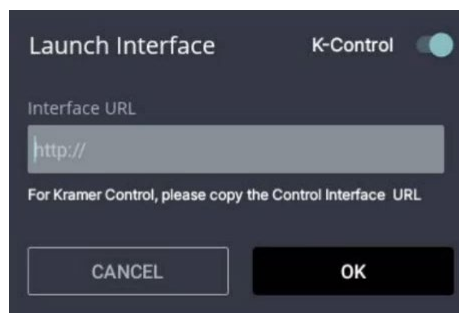


Figure 11: Kramer Control agent, URL entry pop-up

- c. Enter the IP address and port of the interface that was defined in Kramer Brain, for example <https://192.168.88.180:8001>.
- d. By default, the K-Control slider is on, setting the tablet in “Immersive Mode”. In Immersive (full screen) mode, the system bars are hidden and users can exit the interface only by swiping up and entering a PIN. Immersive mode is recommended for the Kramer Control interface; Disable it if you are using a generic webpage.
- e. Press OK and the touch panel will load your interface. To exit the interface and access touch panel controls, slide your fingers up from the bottom of the screen and enter the PIN (default 9428).

2. Entering the Kramer Control URL from a browser on the same network

The following is an alternative method to setting the Kramer Control link on the touch panel. This procedure can be done remotely, without using the touch panel.

Note: The touch panel must be switched on and connected to the same LAN.

- a) Open a browser window on a computer connected to the same network as the touch panel.
- b) Enter the interface URL in the following format:

https://<IP of the touch panel>:9804/launchkramerurl?<IP of the brain interface>:<port #>

For example: if the touch panel's IP is 192.168.0.56 and the Brain interface's IP is "192.168.22.53:8001", then you would enter

`https://192.168.0.56:9804/launchkramerurl?192.168.22.53:8001`

Note: The touch panel port (on the first URL) is 9803 for http and 9804 for https.

If there is more than one interface on the brain it is recommended to copy and paste the highlighted portion of the URL from a browser tab showing the correct interface.

After this command is sent, the touch pad will display the Brain-defined interface.

The following interface commands for the touch panel can be sent from a browser:

- a) Check if the agent is running: *https://<IP of the touch panel>:9804/health/*
Successful response: `{"Status": "up"}`
- b) Reboot the touch panel: *https://<IP of the touch panel>:9804/reboot/*
Successful response: `{"Status": "Rebooting"}`
- c) Clear the interface URL definition in the Control app:
https://<IP of the touch panel>:9804/reseturl/
Successful response: `{"Status": "URL is reset now"}`
- d) Define a new interface URL:
https://<IP of the touch panel>:9804/launchkramerurl?<IP of the interface>:<port#>
Successful response: `Browser will be launched with given URL.`
- e) Define a generic URL (have the touch panel display a non-Brain URL such as *https://www.google.com*): *https://<IP of the touch panel>:9804/launchurl?<full generic URL>*
Successful response: `Browser will be launched with given URL.`

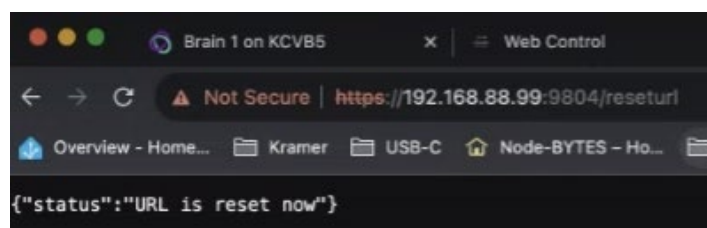


Figure 12: Example of a successful response message.

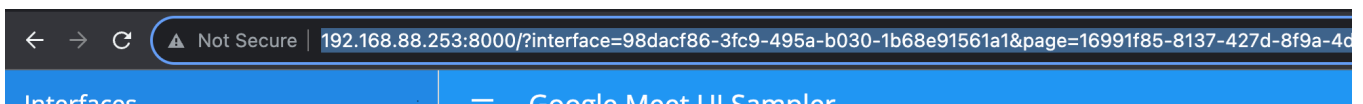
3. Setup the touch panel in the Brain Builder

The advantage of this method is that once defined, any changes to the interface are automatically uploaded to the tablet.

The following assumes that:

- The interface is already setup in the Brain.
- The touch panel is active and connected to the same network as the Brain.
- The IP of the touch panel is static and DHCP assigned.

- Preliminary Setup:** In the **Devices** tab of the Builder screen, add the **K-Agent** driver as a device. It must be assigned to the same network gateway as the touch panel.
- Navigate to the Brain** control page on your computer.
- Select the interface** that you want to use on the touch panel.
- Copy the interface's URL** from the address bar (see the image below).



- Navigate back to the Builder, double click on the touch panel (in the **Devices** list) and paste the URL from the previous step to the **Kramer Control URL**. Assign it a **Friendly Name**.

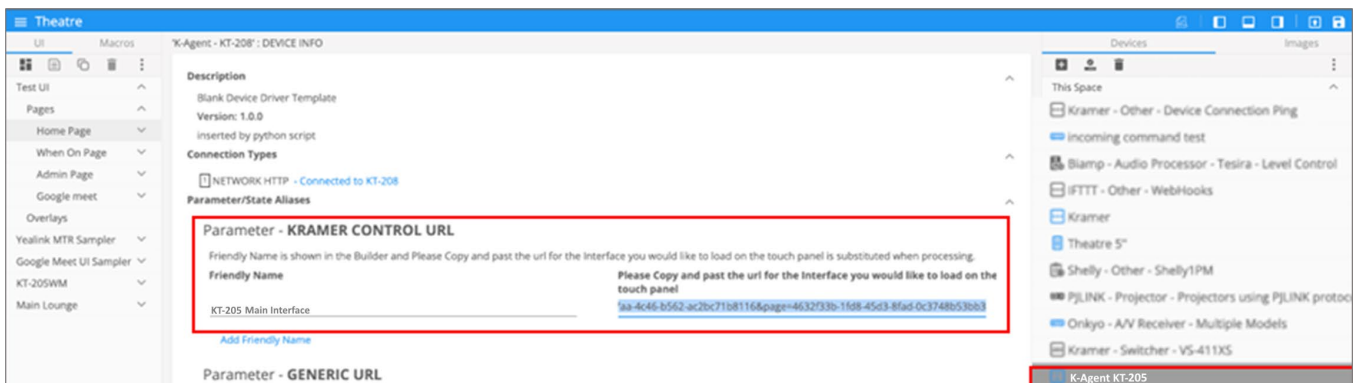


Figure 13: Kramer Control URL in the Builder

- For the Brain to be able to automatically assign the user interface to the touch panel:

(see the image on the next page)

- In the **Events** tab, click **System Events** and select "Initialization".
- Drag the **Launch Kramer URL** command to the 'Initialization' ACTIONS area.
- Select the **Friendly Name** (If only one interface is defined, it will be used by default).

Advanced Settings

Factory Reset & Reboot

The **Settings > Reset** options menu enables you to perform a factory reset or to reboot the device, reset Wi-Fi or Bluetooth or reset app preferences.

Resetting to Factory Default Parameters

To reset the device to its factory default settings:

1. If necessary, swipe up from the bottom of the screen to bring up the PIN entry pop-up and enter the PIN (default 9428).
2. From the Home page, open the **Settings** screen .
3. Select **Reset options > Erase all data (factory reset)**.
4. Press **Erase all data**.

Other options available are Reboot device, Reset Wi-Fi, mobile & Bluetooth and Reset app preferences.

Resetting with the External Reset Button

Insert a pin into the pinhole on the back ③ (see [Defining KT-205WM 5.5" Touch Panel](#) on page 5) and hold for 22 seconds to reset the device to factory default values.


A second pinhole on the top ② restarts the device when a pin is inserted for a few seconds.

Logging Activity

By default, the device does not log activity. Logging can be useful for debugging or monitoring use.

Activating Logging

To activate logging:

1. If necessary, swipe up from the bottom of the screen to bring up the PIN entry pop-up and enter the PIN (default 9428).
2. From the Home page, open the **Settings** screen .
3. Select **Log > Log Location** and select one of Store to internal storage, Store to SD card or Do not store.

Logging is activated.

Accessing an Internally Stored Log File

A USB flash drive and OTG cable are required to copy an internally stored log file.

To access an internally stored log file:

1. In the root directory of the flash drive, create a folder called “**_dump_debug_log**”.
2. Connect the OTG cable to the micro-USB connection on the back of the device.
3. Connect the flash drive to the OTG cable.
4. The device will automatically download the log file to the USB device and issue a confirmation message “**Saved log file to USB storage**”.
